- What is Reportable Service Activity?
 - There are 2 types of RSA:
 - <u>Direct</u> Lions and Leos plan and implement a service project to serve community needs and interact directly with the people being served.
 - <u>Indirect</u> When Lions serve but do not interact directly with beneficiaries.
 - In MyLion, you can measure the impact of your service activity or project by reporting the following metrics:
 - Number of people served (adults and youth)
 - Number of volunteers who participated (Lions, Leos, and nonmembers)
 - Number of volunteer hours spent in planning, fundraising, and implementing the activity or project.
 - Additional metrics to report environment and community improvement service activities.
- Club secretaries and / or Club GSTs please let your <u>District GST</u> know your service activities and send your pictures to Lion Angela Helwig at <u>angelahelwig57@gmail.com</u>. We will share your service activities through our State Newsletter and State Website. We hope to learn from each other!
- **November is Diabetes month!** Plan now to include service activities around Diabetes. November 14TH is **World Diabetes Day!** Some clubs have already recognized Diabetes with speaking engagements.
- Keys to **measuring our GST success**:
 - o Communication with your clubs to identify any GAT needs.
 - Your monthly District GST report by the 5th of each month helps me complete our MD18 GST report for the Council of Governors and our MD18 GST E-Blast. Please include club Service Activities to share.

- Start your plans on one or two <u>fun</u> <u>District-wide Service Activity</u> <u>projects</u> identifying at least <u>one of our 5 Initiatives</u> using any number of Lions Clubs or Leos as collaborators <u>and</u> participants. Can you imagine the huge volunteer hours this project will give your District? Not to mention the possible \$\$\$ amount to your District Initiative charity or our GA Initiatives (GA Lions Lighthouse and GA Lions Camp), Leader Dogs or LCIF.
- I mentioned on Page 14 of our July GST Guideline, by April 10, 2024, I would like to receive a list of all your clubs who completed all 5 Initiatives. After careful consideration, I moved this date to April 1, 2024, to have a total number of FY2023 2024 Service Banner Patches made to order <u>before</u> our April 26 28, 2024 State Convention.

Using this same list, you will have the privilege of doing the District **Certificate of Excellence** award and present it to the respective clubs at the State Convention District Breakfast. When you have time, perhaps do a **mock-up** so that our Team can vote on the Certificate we feel most representative of our 5 Initiatives.

• <u>Success Stories</u> – Encourage your clubs to share their stories. From simple community service projects to large, comprehensive projects (e.g., multiple club eye screening), reporting will shine a light on how—and where—local clubs are making a difference in their communities! As a State, each District can learn from each other.
