**District Reports:**

- **District N GST – PCC Cathy Williams - District Goals – Yearend review:**
  - Several clubs had membership growth for the year.
  - Successful in helping clubs identify service activity Initiative, instead of “Other”.
  - Successful in helping clubs work as a whole unit on a few projects.
  - Did a Zoom Service Training on June 18<sup>th</sup>. Identified several opportunities for the new fiscal year.
  - 18-N had a very good year doing lots of service in a wide variety of ways across the District and State and getting much better at reporting. Assisted several clubs requesting assistance.
  - 18-N participated in all State Service Projects.

- District N – GST PCC Cathy Williams - LCI Goals – Yearend Results:
  - Maintain Service Project Implementation and Reporting:  
**All 48 clubs reported Service Activities to LCI.** Note: Our 2 District-wide Service Projects will help us meet the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> LCI goals.
  - The 5% Diabetes Project Implementation:  
Little improvement; however, our clubs have learned to combine projects toward Initiatives.
  - Advocacy Opportunities:  
Work on a new service option to share with children in need for the Youth initiative.
- I pulled other service activities around the State:
  - Fundraisers, care packages, food bank, public safety night, dictionaries to middle schools, Home Depot Kids Workshop, herb education, scout lodge maintenance, eyeglass recycling, camp support, TREN challenge, Dunkin Tank for Hunger, Diabetes Sunflower Festival, Shepherds Food Bank, Farmers to Families Giveaway, Vision Screening, treats for nursing home and eyeglass applications – to name a few!
- A recent LCI ruling caught my attention — **“What is not reportable service!”**

- LCI says...“Many Lions and Leos serve their communities individually, outside of the activities planned by their clubs, districts, or multiple districts. Some examples include bringing a meal to a neighbor, driving a parent to a medical appointment, or volunteering at their place of worship. This type of work is important and commendable; *however, it should not be reported as Lions’ service activity.*”

I say...this is highly debatable! Lions serve with kindness! We are taught this from the very beginning! Not to say the above is entirely wrong, but MD18 Georgia feels that every act of kindness should be counted. So, an individual Lion must present his/her concern to the club and the club endorses the act of kindness, it is counted and credited to one of our Initiatives. This will avoid a credit to the “Other” category service activity” for lack of significance. Meetings fall into the “Other” category. However, if a meeting includes discussions about a fundraiser for one of our Initiatives, a portion of that meeting can be credited to the respective Initiative, e.g. Diabetes.
