 PDG Philip Smith reports that MD Lions and Leos Pediatric Cancer Awareness with local groups were successful in the 1st half of our FY. There were 10,245 people served with 55 MD service projects and over 2,933 service hours completed.

The Joshua Block Party officially commenced and will conclude at the State Convention at the Porter Center – Dublin in April. He asks all Lions to bring their Lego's to their District Convention or the State Convention.

 As we enter the last half of this fiscal year, please share with your clubs the following, hopefully at your upcoming District Convention:

PJ Packs for the State Convention in April – new PJs with price tags, folded and placed inside a gallon zip lock bag with the ID INSERT, e.g., "Lions of Georgia, GIRL – SIZE _____". A couple of months ago, I sent a copy that has 2 Inserts per page to all District GSTs. Hopefully, each District GST will bring 200 PJ Packs to the State Convention for our PJ Pack Service Project. You might put a PJ Pack together to show everyone at your District Convention. I also asked that you select 2 or 3 clubs to focus on all sizes of under ware and

socks instead of PJs. Sizes are **Toddlers 1 – 3, Small 4 – 6, Medium 7 – 10, Large 11 – 14** and **X-Large 15 – 18.** CHOA – Egleston advised that ages 15 – 18 are always in need!

The PJ Pack Service Project has been moved to 10:30 AM on Saturday, April 27th. I will follow up with our State Leo Chair to ask their assistance in sorting under ware and socks into designated baskets prior to 10:30 AM and/or maybe Leos might have time on Friday evening to sort as well. Otherwise, we will have to sort.

Encourage all Lions (via your upcoming District Convention and a GST Release via your District Cabinet Secretary) to start purchasing new PJs and place in a gallon zip lock bag and bring to your District Convention and the final destination--the Lions State Convention in Dublin!

Encourage all attendees to donate some time at this State Convention Service Project and that their <u>volunteer hours</u> in purchasing PJs and participation at the State Project should be reported to their club secretary for volunteer hours credited to **Diabetes or Childhood Cancer**. Volunteer hours by family and friends should also be reported.

 Patch at the State Convention District L, I, O & N Sunday meetings. Each of YOU will
 present this award! May I have your TOTAL by March 31 to order Service Banner Patches
 for your District. We proudly use the Service Banner Patch designed by District GST / PCC
 Cathy Williams (District N). Thank you for your creativity, Ms. Cathy!
- Finally, all clubs are encouraged to participate in the State Convention Club Tri-fold Service
 Contest. A flyer has been released to all Lions by the Convention Committee. The
 Committee is processing the location that these Tri-folds will be displayed at the State
 Convention.
- As I'm made aware of current events and updates, I will keep you in the loop so that you can share with your District Lions.
- Based on the Service Projects at our State Convention, each <u>District</u> Convention should have a large box for <u>Lego's</u> and another large box for <u>PJ Packs</u> (new PJs with price tags in a gallon zip lock bag with an ID insert furnished by you). Either the District GST or a designated Lion will bring them to the State Convention for a final count.

Together, we will make sure Diabetic and Childhood Cancer patients are remembered in our hearts!

When a child receives a PJ Pack in the hospital, you can bet his or her parents will know it came from *Lions of Georgia*!

- All volunteer hours at the State Convention PJ Pack Service Project will also be credited to Diabetes or Childhood Cancer by club secretaries. Let's make this a banner year for our young Diabetics and Childhood Cancer patients.
- Service the 1st half of this fiscal year has shown great progress in our State with Vision,
 Hunger and Environment, even though Diabetes and Childhood Cancer remain far behind.
 But this is evidence that our Lions are creating a better world for their communities.
