A memorial park cleanup & replanted with new shrubs, a food drive for special Easter meals for the elderly, eye glass collections, sponsored a STAR Student Banquet, Community Health Fair, a Poker Run for Childhood Cancer Awareness, vision Screening, Park Bench Donation, and <u>Moultrie Leo's</u> were busy last week. Here is an excerpt from their Facebook page: "We had a fantastic day of community service on Thursday! First, we focused on literacy and social emotional learning (SEL) with Lions Clubs focusing on "Kindness Matters." We buddy read "A Little Spot of Kindness" and talked about what the book means in Pre-K, 1st, and 3rd grade classes at Stringfellow Elementary School. Then we had our buddy read some pages, tell us the colors of the spots in the books, and make plans for ways to be kind for the next week. We gave each student their own copy of the book; and their teacher got a class book, too. After our literacy project, we sorted eyeglasses for recycling, and bagged food for the Colquitt County Food Bank. We even sent some food home to neighbors who needed it."
